The Hall of Fame luncheon at the Omni Rancho Las Palmas Resort and Spa in Rancho Mirage features former New York Times Executive Editor Dean Baquet, who will deliver the keynote address.

Four highly regarded media professionals, all of whom dedicated their careers to informing and entertaining Coachella Valley residents, will be honored. They are:

- "La Poderosa" radio personality Adolfo Íñiguez
- Celebrity columnist and broadcaster Gloria Greer (posthumous)

Journalist of the Year and Rising Star awards, too

Along with the Hall of Fame inductees, CVJF will also name its Journalist of the Year and Rising Star award recipients at the luncheon in Rancho Mirage.

The Journalist of the Year Award honors a professional who has demonstrated excellence and high ethical standards in coverage of the Coachella Valley with journalism that had a significant impact on the community in the past year.

The Rising Star Award honors a journalist under age 30 (or with less than 5 years in the industry) who has worked for a valley media organization for at least a year and produced notable journalism in the previous year that indicates they will be a strong contributor to telling the Valley's story in the years to come.

Each of the journalism award winners receives a cash prize partially underwritten by the California News Publishers Association.
