A quick word on grants awarded by CVJF so far in 2025

We're nearly halfway through the year so we wanted to provide you with a quick glance at the initiatives we've funded with your generous contributions:

 Underwrote the salary of The Desert Sun's opinion editor through the first quarter of 2025 when Nicky Loomis decided to leave the news organization. CVJF's focus has now shifted to supporting the newspaper's coverage of philanthropy and nonprofits.

- Granted five news organizations money to hire interns or fellows this summer. The
 organizations are: The Coachella Valley Independent, The Desert Sun, El Informador Del
 Valle, KESQ, and The Palm Springs Post.
- Launched a dollar-for-dollar fundraising campaign to help the new Indio Post with startup costs. CVJF will match all contributions up to \$12,000.
- Provided The Desert Sun with a small grant to purchase two pairs of safety boots for its journalists, specifically photographers, who cover wildfires across Southern California.

Two Valley newsrooms score wins as some of the best in California



Congratulations to The Desert Sun and The Coachella Valley Independent. Both newsrooms took home top prizes at the recent California News Publishers Association's journalism awards. Among medium-sized newspapers, The Desert Sun was honored in 32 categories, including first place for breaking news,

environment reporting, feature photography, and in-depth reporting. The Coachella Valley Independent was recognized in 24 categories among small daily newspapers and weeklies. It won top honors for best newsletter, homelessness reporting, and fine arts writing.
